The committee ensures that these students are not subjected to discrimination and have equal opportunities to succeed academically and socially.

As per UGC and AICTE directives, every institution must establish such a committee to oversee the implementation of reservation policies, extend support services, and provide a redressal mechanism in cases of grievances. The NAAC Accreditation Framework also mandates the presence of such a body as part of ensuring inclusivity and equity in higher education institutions.

Roles and Responsibilities:

1. **Redressal of Grievances:** Address complaints of discrimination or harassment faced by SC/ST students.
2. **Counseling & Guidance:** Provide academic, emotional, and career counselling to SC/ST students to help them adjust and thrive in college life.
3. **Monitoring and Implementation:** Ensure implementation of UGC/AICTE reservation norms in admissions, scholarships, fellowships, and hostel allocations.
4. **Awareness Programmes:** Organise seminars, workshops, and sensitization programs for students and faculty to foster social inclusion.
5. **Support in Academic Matters:** Help SC/ST students access remedial coaching, language labs, and tutorial assistance where needed.
6. **Liaison Work:** Coordinate with the college administration to ensure policy compliance and student welfare.

7. **Annual Reporting:** Maintain records and submit periodic reports on the committee's activities to the college authorities and regulatory bodies.

At Tetso College, the SC/ST Committee plays a critical role in creating a supportive, safe, and fair educational environment for all students. It acts not only as a grievance redressal body but also as an enabling platform that works toward empowering marginalised students. By ensuring equitable access to academic resources, financial aid, and emotional support, the committee contributes to the overall mission of inclusivity and social justice in higher education. Ultimately, it helps build a campus culture that values diversity, dignity, and equal opportunity for all.


